Activity 1: The Duck Game

A fun game to get you thinking about the different aspects of will writing.

What you need to play the game:



- 2 or more players



- A bowl of water



- A permanent marker



Activity 1: The Duck Game

What you need to play the game:



- Rubber Ducks with hooks on top



- A small fishing rod



- Question cards from the resource booklet

Setting up the game:



1. Using the permanent marker write the numbers 1-5 on the bottom of the ducks



2. Fill the bowl up with water.



3. Place the bowl on a table



4. Place the ducks into the water



5. Place the question cards in groups of the different colours.

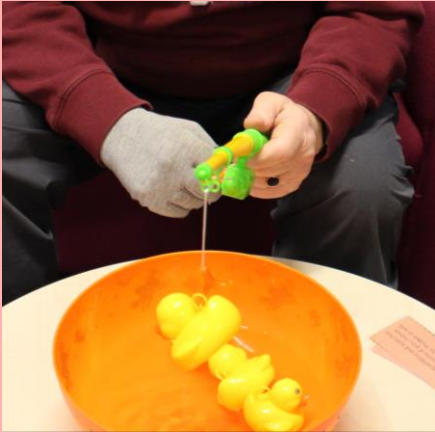


6. Place the fishing rod next to the bowl.



7. Choose someone who will read out the questions and answers.

Playing the game:



1. The first player will use the fishing rod to hook a duck out of the bowl.



2. The player will then check the number on the duck.



3. The player reading the question pick up the question card:

Duck 1 = Pink
Duck 2= Blue
Duck 3= Orange
Duck 4= Green



4. The first player must try to answer the question.



5. If they get it correct, they win a point.

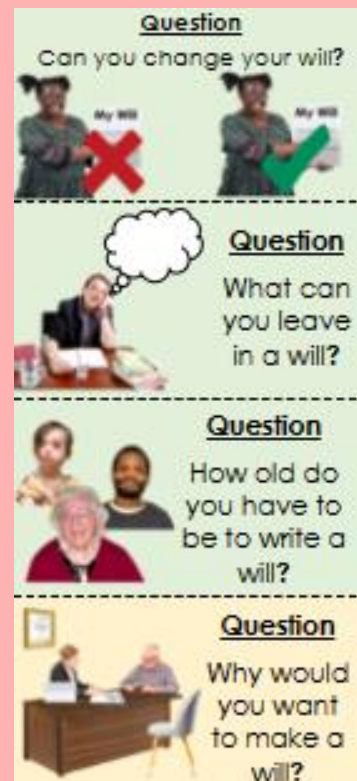


6. If they get it wrong, then they can try again on their next turn.



7. The person with the most points at the end wins.

Activity 2: Snakes and Ladders

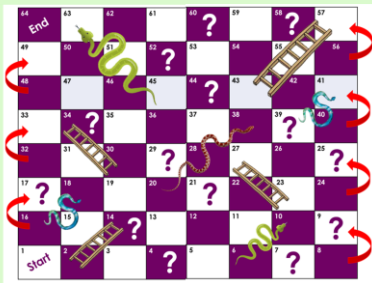


This game is a fun way to test your knowledge about will writing.

What you need to play the game:



- 2 or more players



- The Snakes and Ladders board from **The Will Writing Activity Booklet (Pages 18-19)**.



- Counters (You can use any objects you like!)



- A Dice



- The question cards from **The Will Writing Resource Booklet (Pages 35 - 38)**.

Setting up the Game:



1. Place the game board, question and the dice on the table.



2. Each player must choose a counter.



3. The team must pick a player who will read out the questions.



4. The player who rolls the highest number on the dice will go first.

Playing the Game:



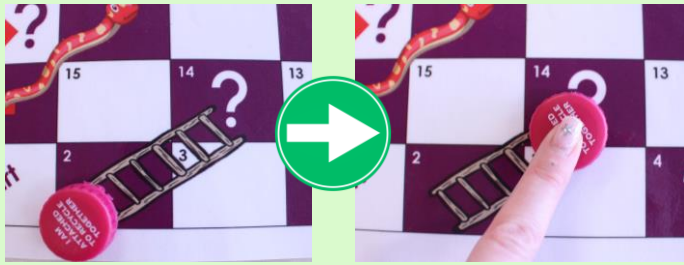
4. That player must roll the dice.



5. Then the player will move counter the amount of squares the dice says.



6. The players must take turns to do this.



7. If the counter lands on the bottom of a ladder, the player can move up to the top.



8. If the counter lands on the head of the snake, the player must move down to the end of the tail.



9. If the counter lands on the 'Q' then you must answer a question card.



10. If the answer is correct, then you can roll again.

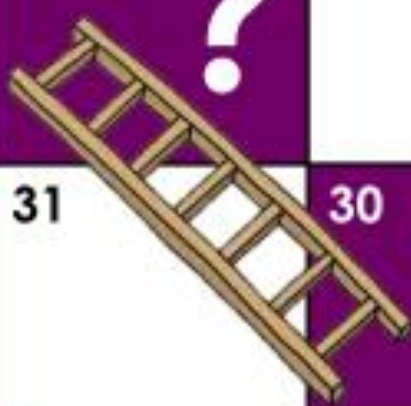
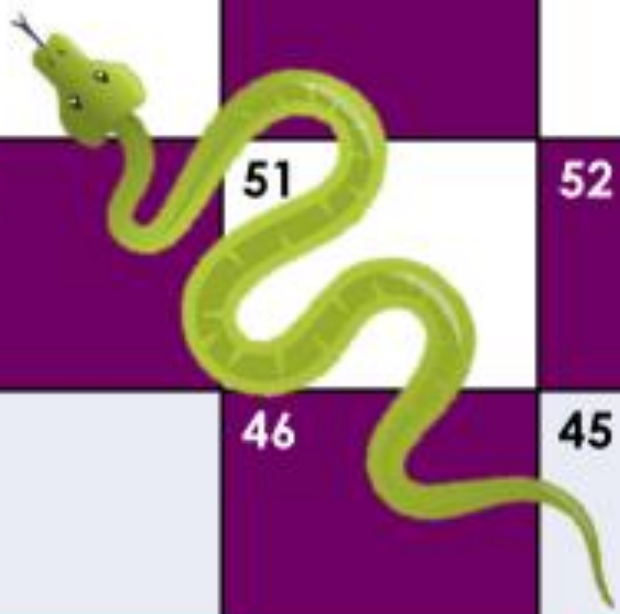


11. If the answer is wrong, then you must stay in the same square.



12. The first person to land on square 64 wins.

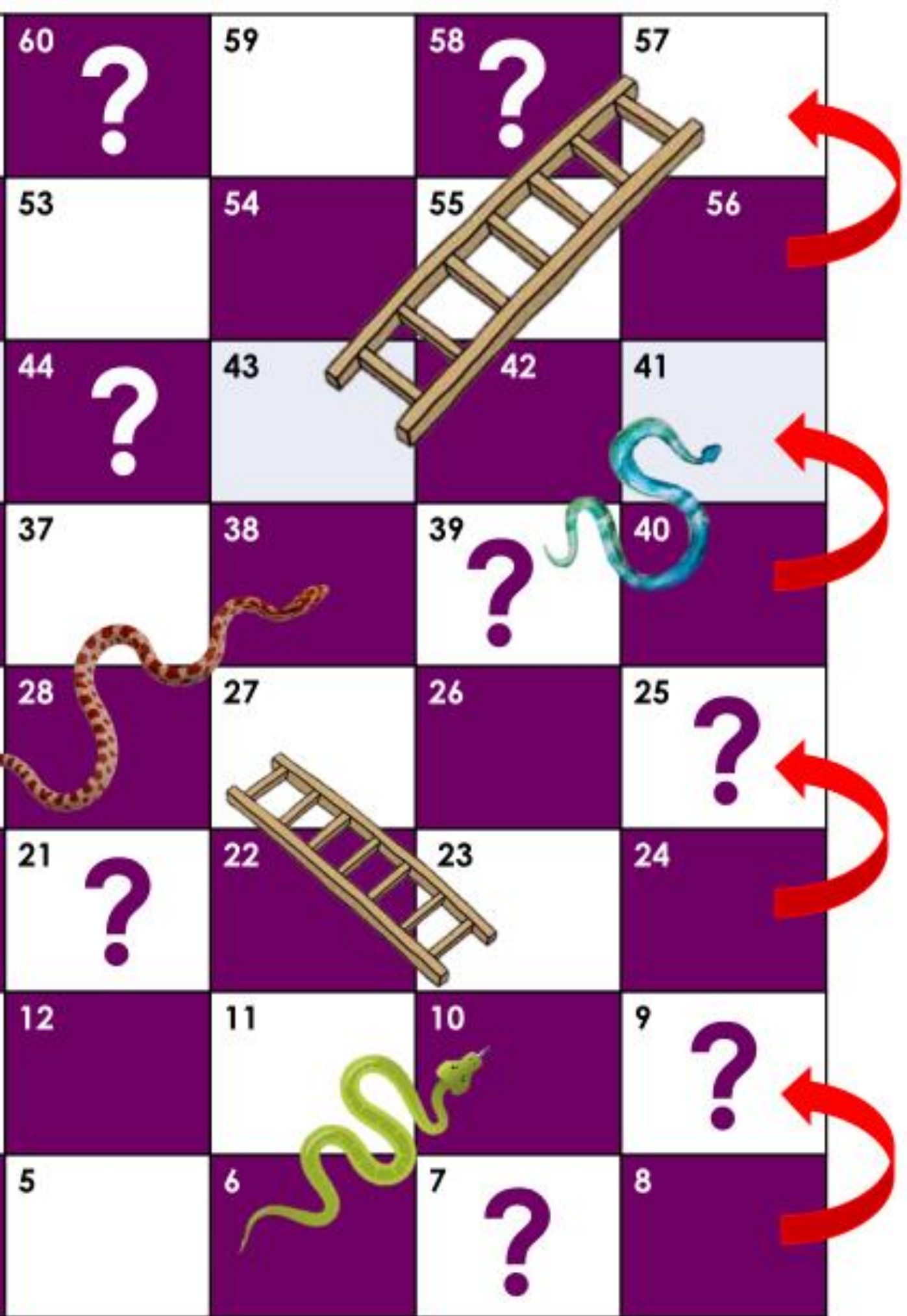
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Activity 3: Ring Toss

Setting Up the Game

This game will help to answer some questions that you may have about will writing.

Making the Cone and Rings



In the 'Will Writing Resource Booklet' (Page 5- 34) you will find the materials you need to make the cones and ring.

You will Also need



- Scissors



- Sellotape



- A Glue Stick

Activity 3: Ring Toss

Setting Up the Game



Making the Cone and Rings

1. Print out page 5- 35 of the Will Writing Resource Booklet.



2. Cut Along the dotted lines on each sheet.



3. After cutting along the lines on the hoop sheets, the hoops are done.



4. To make cones, you need to fold along the solid line to make a flap.



Activity 3: Ring Toss

Setting Up the Game



Making the Cone and Rings



5. Add some glue to the flap.



6. Join the sides to make the cone shape.



7. Add tape along the join to secure the cone.



8. Fold this circle shape in half and cut along the dotted lines in the centre.

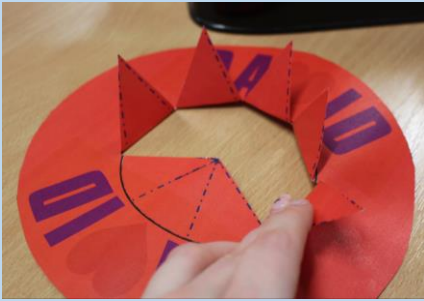
Activity 3: Ring Toss

Setting Up the Game



Making the Cone and Rings

9. Fold over the flaps you have created to make them stand up.



10. Insert the base into the cone and stick down the flaps inside the cone with tape.

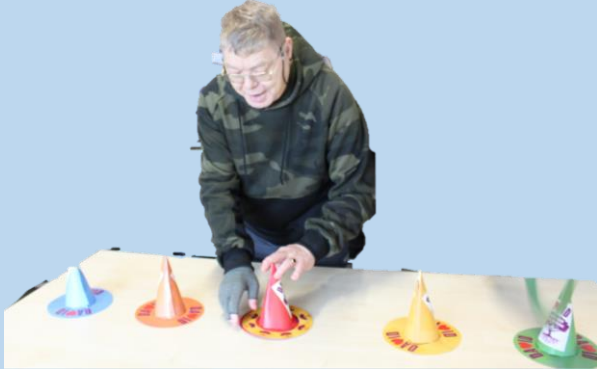


11. Then the cone is complete.



Activity 3: Ring Toss

Setting Up the Game



1. Place cones in a line on a table



2. Put the same colour question cards next to the cones.



3. There must be a person chosen to read out the questions.



4. Mark out a space where the players will stand

Playing the Game:



5. The players must each collect a hoop.



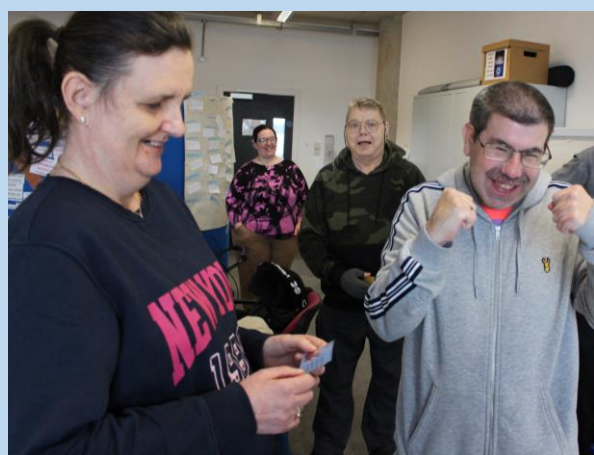
6. All players must stand in a line from the marked spot in front of the cones.



7. The players must take it in turns to throw the hoops onto the cones.



8. If the hoop lands on the cone, then the player must answer a question.



9. If the players gets the question right, then they receive a point.



10. If the players get the question wrong, then they will not get a point.



11. The winner of the game is the person with the most points.



Activity 4: In My Will Game

This game is a great way to get you thinking about what things you might want to leave in your will.



One example of a game you could use to learn more about Will Writing is 'In my will, I will leave...' game.

This is an adaptation of the 'I'm going to the market to buy ...' game

What will you need?



- A group of over four players

Instructions




1. The group of players must get into a circle.



I'll go 1st.

3. The first player must begin the game by saying 'In my will, I will leave...'

Instructions

...a bike.



4. The player can say any object, for example a bike.

In my will, I will leave a bike....



5. Then the next player says 'In my will, I will leave a bike...'

...and a phone.



6. Then this player will add their own object to the list, for example a phone.

Instructions




In my will, I will leave a bike, a phone and...

7. The next player will then say, 'In my will, I will leave 'a bike and a phone'.



...a watch.

8. Then this player will say their own object to the list.



I have forgotten!
Let's stop.

9. This will continue until someone forgets the objects in the list or players decide to stop.



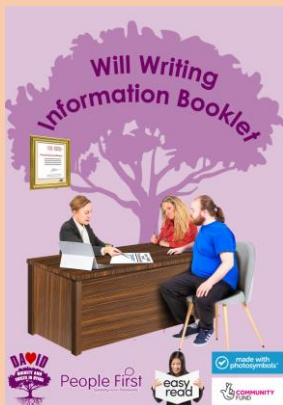
Creating Your Own Game

Our **Will Writing Booklet** has all the information you need.

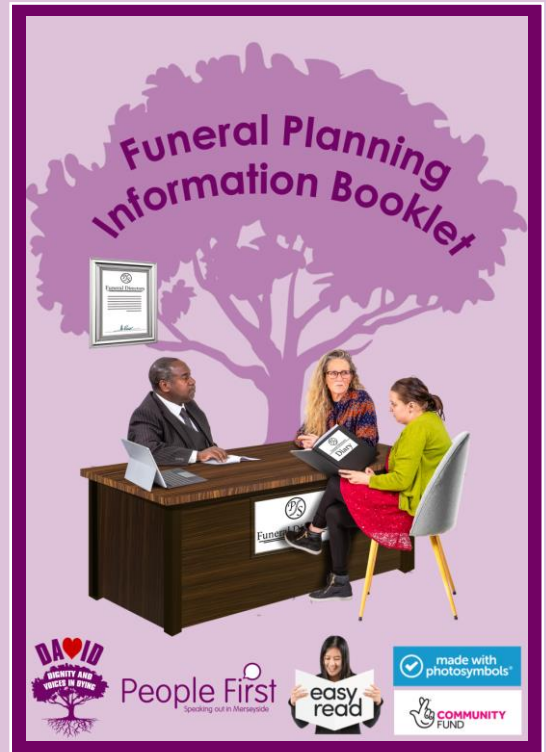
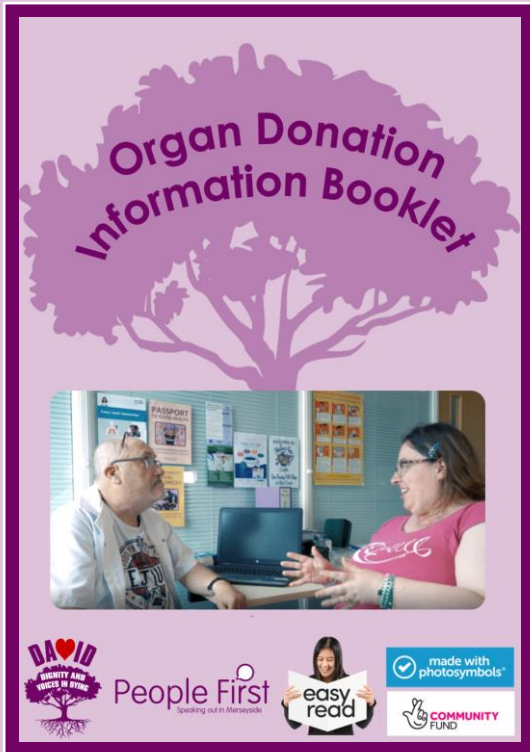

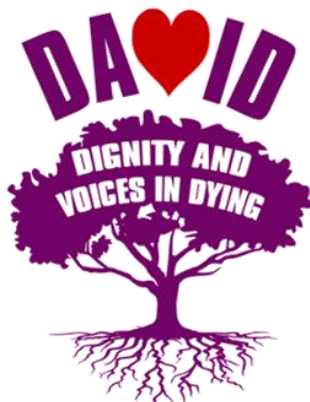
